Building Fund: Each year every parent who has chosen to send their child to a voluntary-aided Catholic School is asked to make a contribution to the school Building Fund so that the school can continue to provide the best possible teaching and learning environment. If you would like us to provide your child with additional Mathematics and Reading work, please let the office know. Outdoor activities will also be available (weather permitting). Children will be offered a healthy breakfast, lunch and afternoon snack with choices of fresh fruit, fresh juice, milk or water.






Attendance and Punctuality:

As a school, we are working with the Local Authority to improve our overall attendance. You will need to provide evidence for illnesses longer than three days. A reminder, that holidays taken during term time will not be authorised by the school. Unauthorised absence may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice, being issued by the Borough of Waltham Forest. The local Authority will be looking into absences that are taken in the lead up to the holidays and the week we return. We also inform the Local Authority of any persistent absence below 90%.

Any parents who receive a letter from the school, the Local Authority will be sending you a Notification of Parental Responsibility (NPR).



Packed Lunches: According to advice from the Food Standards Agency, a healthy packed lunch should include:

- Meat, fish or a dairy source of protein
- Starchy carbohydrate, such as a wholegrain sandwich, to provide energy
- At least one portion each of a fruit, vegetable or salad
- Water or milk to drink

Please **DO NOT** put crisps, chocolate or fizzy drinks in your child's packed lunch.

We are a nut-free school and as such, please **DO NOT** put nuts or foods that contain nuts in your child's packed lunch. We have children who have nut allergies so they would be put a risk.



On Thursday 14th March, the Year 2 children had a whole day **Great Fire of London** workshop. During the morning, the children used practical activities and drama to find out what it was like living through the Great Fire. They explored many of the jobs of the people in that time, including: a barber surgeon, apothecary, leather worker, chandler, perfumer, baker, metal worker, seamstress and weaver. They also visited a Stuart schoolhouse to make ink and learn how to write with quill pens! In the afternoon, the children began an archaeological investigation. They used 'dig' boxes to search the remains of the fire for artefacts that would help them to find out more about a specific job or family that may have been living in London in 1666.



The Gospel for Sunday 17th March 2024 1 EXALTATION THROUGH SUFFERING

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them: 'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you, most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yidds a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life If a man serves me, he must follow me; wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!' A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours. Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.'
